Our Goals



Stirling Lawn Tennis & Squash Club

- SLT&SC is situated in the heart of residential Stirling. It has 3, extremely well maintained all-weather (Tiger Turf) tennis courts which are floodlit and also within its clubhouse, 2 squash courts.
- At its heart, it is a family orientated club. Whilst competitive tennis is played within the club and within the Central District leagues, the courts are used significantly by members for social tennis. As well as club nights, we have an extremely active membership including our over 55s tennis, coaching and in-house leagues. In addition, the club has a strong junior membership with over 400 hours annually devoted to formal junior coaching.
- Squash has seen a strong recent uptake with increases in membership and the establishment of team matches. The squash courts also gain considerable usage for racket ball.
- The club-house facilities unfortunately do not match our tennis and squash facilities. Whilst well maintained, the club house is in real need of an upgrade. Disability access is not of the standard we want or need; some changing room facilities require upgrade to meet safeguarding requirements and our general facilities require upgrade to allow us to be more accessible and inclusive across the community.
- The club wishes to embark on an improvement programme to address the high-level issues stated above.

Our Background



- The club was established in 1878 making it one of the 3 oldest tennis clubs in Scotland some evidence suggests it might be the oldest.
- Originally there were just 2 blaes courts but a third was added in the 1950s. In the 1960s and 70s with the increasing
 interest in squash the new clubhouse was built incorporating the 2 squash courts which were opened in September
 1976. These were the first squash courts in Stirling. The club was renamed at this time to its current title.
- The tennis courts were resurfaced as all-weather artificial grass courts in 2000 and floodlights were also added. The tennis court surface was completely renewed in 2014 and is maintained on a regular basis making it one of the best playing surfaces in the region.
- We have a strong membership of over 240 including families, adults and juniors
- We offer a significant amount of coaching to Adults and Juniors in partnership with Mark Walker (see next slide)

Our Coaching



- Mark Walker is an accredited LTA level 5 Master coach with 25-years experience coaching working from grassroots tennis to developing international players.
- Over the last few years, he has enjoyed being back in clubs helping develop their programmes and mentoring coaches.
- We now have access to a coaching team of 3 providing both individual and group lessons





Why are we looking for Sponsorship?



We are looking to develop the facilities at The Club for new and existing members. This will include:

- Improved accessibility to The club house through the installation of a new safety surface with a future aspiration to provide new disabled toilet facilities
- Enhancing the main club house to provide a space for existing members as well as external groups for social activities and gatherings.
- actively promoting wider inclusion across our community and to provide a safe and welcoming environment that supports the physical and mental wellbeing of its members
- Increasing our membership across all categories by offering excellent tennis, squash and racket ball facilities matched by appropriate club house facilities

- Increase awareness of SLT&SC ensuring greater usage of the club house, tennis and squash courts

SLT&SC wishes to offer local business the opportunity to support the development of the club via a number of sponsorship opportunities. We believe this is an attractive opportunity for you because:


- Our clubhouse and courts sit in the residential heart of Stirling in Snowden Place Lane

- We have and continue to partner with Tennis Scotland, ClubSport Stirling and Active Stirling to support grassroots tennis through the provision of open days for local schools, welcoming over 150 children to our most recent event





Refurbishment Plans Appendices

Phase 1 plans (Internal) – what we would do:



- Remove the main part of the wall between the main area and committee area
- Completely redecorate / re-floor
- Completely replace the kitchen area including appliances
- Re-position the storage cupboard to create additional catering preparation space
- Remove the existing emergency single door and replace with UPVC double door
- Remove the existing wooden bench seating and radiators (replacing radiators with vertical ones)
- Create a new UPVC double door replacing an existing window in the main area
- Refurb of existing main door
- Provision of new seating and tables

Phase 2 plans – External



Replacement of the Flat Roof above the main club house

Accessibility:

- The aim of this phase would be to focus on our accessibility to promote the wider use of our club house and tennis and squash facilities. This would include:
 - Rubberised safety surface to front of the club house
 - Replacement of current Emergency exit door with a disabled access door including ramp access
 - Provision of safety net to protect picnic area from balls from tennis courts
- Depending on estimates, this work may be completed in combination with Phase 1.

Phase 3 plans – Enhanced Disabled facilities



- The creation of an externally accessed disabled changing area, shower and toilet
- This will utilise an Existing access point and a spare area at the rear of the ladies and gents changing rooms. Some space is required from an under-utilised area of the ladies changing room
- Specific funding will be sought for this development
